The Columbia Model United Nations Conference and Exposition (CMUNCE) Code of Conduct is valid for all conference hours and on all conference premises and locations, both at Columbia University and at the conference hotels. All delegates are expected to follow conference policies and guidelines for their own safety and that of other delegates and conference staff. Failure to comply may result in early departure from the conference for both the student and/or the delegation. Our priorities here at the conference are to ensure a safe and stimulating environment for debate and learning. We sincerely hope that you enjoy the conference!

- 1) Delegates shall not participate in any activities in violation of either conference regulations, or the laws of New York City and New York State.
- 2) Delegates shall not possess, transport, or consume alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs. Delegates may not smoke.
- 3) Delegates shall not verbally, physically, or sexually harass members of any other delegation or the conference staff.
- 4) Delegates staying at conference hotels should kindly observe a curfew of 1 AM (one o'clock AM) at which time all delegates should be in their respective rooms.
- 5) Delegates shall kindly observe sensitivity towards all races, religions, and ideologies as sensitivities may often run high during debates of international subjects.
- 6) Delegates will not bring computers, laptops, or any other electronic device with writing programs to use during conference hours. Delegates may use these devices at their leisure during off time. Please contact the Secretariat if there is a medical reason which prevents you from hand-writing documents during the conference.
- 7) Delegates will not bring pre-written resolutions to any committee sessions.
- 8) Delegates may not receive substantive help from advisors during committee sessions.
- 9) Delegates should bring any disturbances or infractions to the attention of their immediate Dais staff. If the Dais staff is unable to resolve the situation, it will be brought to the attention of the Secretariat, who will work with the appropriate parties. All Secretariat decisions are final.
